

advised that LUCIANO, #92-168, was originally received at Sing Sing Irom
June 18, 1936 to serve a term of 30 to 50 years. He was transferred to
Clinton Prison, Damemora, New York, on July 2, 1936. Subsequently on
May 12, 1942 he was transferred to Great Mesdows Prison, Comstock, New
York, and finally he was returned to Sing Sing on January 9, 1946 where he
was discharged in accordance with a special commutation by Covernor DEWEY
on Pebruary 2, 1946.

LUCIANO. This file contained a copy of the commutation signed by DEMEY but did not include any information as to the reason for LUCIANO'S release. The commutation contained conditions to the effect that the subject would be deported upon his release and that he would be considered a fugitive and required to serve the belance of his term if any time he re-entered the United States.

The Bureau was advised by teletype dated to the the effect that a review of the file in the New York Office on the case concerning Benator WAISH indicated that there was no evidence that CHARLES A MAFFENDEN had furnished any information of value which aided in the solution of this case. Investigation by Bureau agents revealed that DR. HARRY RUSSELY STONE, who frequented a house of ill-fame, was mistaken for Senetor DAVID I MAISH.

On May 7, 1942 HAFFENDER, then Lieutenant Commander, called the New York Field Division and stated that he had an individual who knew a person who had been mistaken for Senator WALSH. HAFFENDEN indicated that this information came from the Anti-Defermation League. The informant was on who was interviewed by Bureau agents on May 7, 1942 but was mable to rurnish any information of value.

for Senator TALSH was age 63, and not "80 some odd years old". Also contained in HAFFENDEN's statement was the fact that DR. STONE had never been a state senator as alleged in HAFFENDEN's memorandum, the pertinent portion of which is quoted in the Bureau letter of reference dated May 3, 1946.

Confidential Informant T-1, by letter advised Special agent that CHARLES R. HAFFENDEN resigned from his position in the O'DEYER Administration about May 31, 1946, when he received a memorandum from Mayor O'DEYER telling him to either submit his resignation by mid-night or he would be summarily discharged. HAFFENDEN accordingly resigned. One of the rumored reasons for his resignation, according to T-1, is the allegation that HAFFENDEN formed a corporation with two congressmen from Brooklyn, for the purpose of getting a monopoly on all the concessions at the Idlewild Airport now under construction. The purpose of HAFFENDEN doing this was to gain a monopoly and thereafter grant the concessions out on the basis of subleases. Informant T-1 stated that there was some indication that was trying to gain a Yoothold in the obtaining of these concessions at the Idlewild Airport.

A copy of this report is being furnished the Albany Field Division for the information of that office.

There being no further investigation to be conducted, this case is being closed on the authority of the Special Agent in Charge.
